RPAP EXPERTISE BEING TAPPED

Over the last year RPAP was engaged to assist both Alberta Health and Alberta Infrastructure to finalize two important documents; "Design Guidelines for Continuing Care Facilities in Alberta" and "Family Care Clinics—Facility and Equipment Infrastructure Reference Material". Our job was to review the proposed standards to ensure compliance with both provincial and national standards and that functional and architectural approaches made sense. The Continuing Care Guidelines were included in the ASLI grant RFP earlier this year as well as being presented by Jan Pierzchajlo at a recent ASCHA conference. The Family Care Clinic information will be included in the upcoming RFP by Alberta Health. ●




It is always a joy to be at the opening of a newly completed building. It is extra special when the building is being used for
