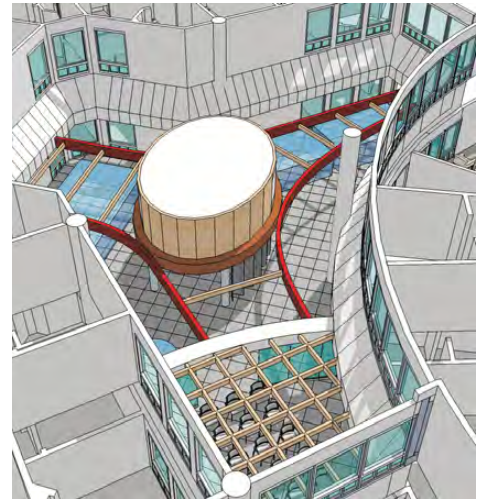

UNDER CONSTRUCTION

- Construction is nearing completion on a Level III Lab for the Alberta Centre for Prions & Protein Folding Diseases, and a renovation and addition to the Viking Health Complex.
- RPAP is nearing completion of working drawings for a major interior renovation to house the Stop Colorectal Cancer through Prevention and Education (SCOPE) program.

- Two community health and wellness clinics in Fort McMurray are in the schematic design phase. Both projects will meet or exceed LEED silver certification.
- RPAP recently completed the final design for a 60 resident continuing care facility in Lloydminster. This design is based on the social model of care and will meet or exceed LEED silver certification.
