Inspired by the small but beautiful La Tempietto chapel in Rome (designed by Danato Bramante), RPAP is currently designing a new chapel addition within a courtyard of the St. Mary's Hospital in Camrose. The chapel will be an intimate place of worship and spirituality for the staff and users of the facility. Like the original, it will be a small architectural gem – both on the inside and when viewed from the outside. The project will be built in 2012 and was made possible by the St. Mary's Hospital, Camrose Foundation.

118th Ave houses the Nina Haggerty Centre for the Arts on the main floor and two levels of affordable housing above. The project won for its "positive and sustainable change to the surrounding community; addresses the impact of the project on the environment, and takes into account the environmental footprint of the project; has a physical design that is intended to make a genuine difference in people's lives; is based on innovative approaches to problem solving; and provides value for money in terms of efficient use of interior space and fits into the surrounding community."
